Overview

Despite substantial effort, preventable harm in health care remains a major concern in the US. Though many evidence-based, effective best practices related to harm reduction have been identified, they are seldom shared or

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implemented effectively. Recognizing the importance of culture, leadership, and governance, patient and family engagement, workforce safety, and the learning system is essential to creating total systems safety.

The Congress focuses on highlighting new approaches that demonstrate systemic improvement harm reduction at various levels (team, department, facility, or organization). This conference aims to create a culture of networked and continuous learning, forging learning systems within and across health care organizations at the local, regional, and national levels to encourage widespread sharing, learning, and improvement.

Educational Objectives

Upon completion of this activity learners should be able to:

1. Recognize safety as a core value and promote the development of a culture of safety at the workforce and organizational level as a precondition of advancing patient safety.
2. Develop and enhance strategies around the four content areas (culture, leadership, and governance; patient and family engagement; workforce safety; and the learning system) to reduce harm and improve patient outcomes.
3. Collaborate with patients, families, and care partners to ensure their meaningful partnership in all aspects of care design, delivery, and operations.
