Care Description Form	Care Settings That Use the Form
Hospital Care Description	This includes inpatient hospital care, inpatient behavioral health, hospital at home, and emergency departments <u>NOT</u> accredited as a GEDA site
Ambulatory Care Description	This includes primary care, PACE at care centers, cancer centers, family medicine centers, hospice care, outpatient behavioral health, spinal cord injury clinics, neuropsychology clinics, capacity clinics, and primary care at home
Convenient Care Clinics Care Description	This includes convenient care clinics and urgent care clinics
Nursing Home Care Description	This includes nursing facilities, long-term care, inpatient rehabilitation facilities, skilled nursing facilities, post-acute care, and assisted living facilities
Home Health Care Description	This includes home health agencies, PACE at home, and skilled services provided in the home
GEDA Care Description_(Geriatric Emergency Department Accredited Sites)	This is only for emergency departments that have achieved GEDA accreditation (any level)
GSV Care Descriptions_(Geriatric Surgery Verification Sites)	This is only for sites that have achieved GSV accreditation (any level)

The following types of care settings are <u>NOT</u> currently eligible for recognition. We encourage you to remain engaged in the Age-Friendly Health Systems movement through webinars and newsletters. Although you are not eligible for recognition, you may also participate in the Action Communities, the Open School Course, and the Online Course with Coaching.
