



Age-Friendly Care System-wide Spread Plan

Guidance for Completing the Spread Plan

The System-wide Spread Plan (Spread Plan) is a tool to help your team articulate a vision for the spread of the 4Ms across the health system and document those actions necessary to meet your aim for system-wide spread.

The Spread Plan is based on the three fundamental questions of the Model for Improvement:

- What are we trying to accomplish? The answer is the spread aim.
- What changes can we make that will result in an improvement? The answer leads to specific change ideas and activities.
- How will we know if a change is an improvement? The answer informs the plan for measures.

The Spread Plan is designed to be completed by the interdisciplinary team who will lead spread of the 4Ms across your health system. It is recommended that the Spread Plan be used as part of an iterative process. IHI recommends using the Age-Friendly Care System-wide Spread Self-Assessment before completing your first draft of the Spread Plan to get a sense of where your system might want to focus. Update the Spread Plan as your activities progress and new insights are gained. We hope that this tool will support your learning and improvement as you pursue reliable, equitable age-friendly care for all older adults in your health system.
