IHI Age-Friendly System-Wide Spread Learning Collaborative Application



The Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) is excited to launch the Age-Friendly System-Wide Spread Collaborative ("Collaborative").

Application for the Collaborative is open to US health systems, hospitals, ambulatory care practices, convenient care clinics and nursing homes that have at least two sites of care recognized as Committed to Care Excellence (CCE).

IHI will accept Collaborative applications (this form and a letter of commitment from a system senior leader) through February 2, 2024.

Final decisions for the Collaborative will be released by March 1, 2024.

IHI will make participation decisions to ensure representation from a range of health systems across diverse geography, size, and patient populations. Health systems not selected for the Collaborative will have the opportunity to join learning activities open to all Age-Friendly Health Systems through the Participant Community. The Participant Community will explore similar learning content to deepen the practice of the 4Ms across health systems. These opportunities are in development and will begin in early 2024. More information about the Age-Friendly Health Systems Participant Community will be available on ihi.org/AgeFriendly.

Health systems are also welcome to join the upcoming Age-Friendly Action Community, launching in March 2024. In the Action Community, teams from across different health systems come together to accelerate their work of putting the 4Ms into practice. During the 7-month virtual learning community, your team will test the 4Ms Framework and share learnings. The Collaborative begins in April 2024 and ends in September 2025.
